- born in Ceuta in 476 H./1083 C.
- died in Marrakech in 544 /1149





Ṣaḥīḥ Muslim has been transmitted through two authoritative transmitters: Abū Isḥāq Ibrāfīm b. Muḥammad b. Sufyān (d. 308/920) and Abū Muḥammad Aḥmad b. 'Alī al-Qalānisī. The second main line of transmission called *riwāyat al-Qalānisī* was known only in al-Maġrib. Ibn aṣ-Ṣalāḥ is quoted as saying: "As for al-Qalānisī, [...] I found his version of Ṣaḥīḥ Muslim among the maghribis, and nowhere else."
